The German federal election of 2017 is considered historic and, like no other election before, still has an immense influence on current politics. Whereas the election campaigns of the top candidates such as Merkel and Schulz were exploited in detail by the media, we lack a focus on the campaigns of the grass roots of the political parties, far away from Berlin. The film accompanies six young politicians of the biggest political parties from Rhineland-Palatinate during the crucial phase of the election campaign and we see the variety of challenges young politicians have to face. Despite the difficulties, they all have to act according to the motto "Keep on fighting!".

CULTURES OF RESISTANCE FILMS

FROM TRASH TO TREASURE: turning negatives to positives

Duration: 24 minutes, English Subtitles, Director: Iara Lee

In Lesotho—a highland country surrounded by South Africa—an artist named Nthabiseng TeReo Mohanela takes discarded materials and transforms them into unique clothing and accessories. Teaching young people the benefits of recycling and re-creation, she calls her project "From Trash to Treasure." With TeReo's work as a starting point, this short film showcases a broader spirit of reimagination among artists in Lesotho, who use creativity to respond to entrenched social problems: Filmmakers show the need to end child marriage. Musicians write songs about climate change. Farmers collect seeds to protect endangered tree species. Designers use fashion to preserve traditional Basotho culture and challenge common perceptions of Africa. Profiling a variety of these innovators, the film encourages us to take lessons from those who rethink, reuse, and reinvent in order to promote positive change. Cultures of Resistance Films are making their films available for free online.

Brain Mechanisms of Sight Recovery

Speaker: Prof. Dr. rer. nat. Brigitte Röder, Head of Biological Psychology and Neuropsychology, University of Hamburg, Germany

Brain mechanisms of sight recovery

If infants are born blind, their brains are able to adjust by enhancing non-visual senses such as hearing and touch in order to compensate for visual loss. If sight is restored later in life, it is often assumed that recovery is highly limited in those who receive e.g. cataract surgery only in late childhood or as adults. In fact, visual impairments remain in these individuals but there is a lot of recovery too and some functions reach close to typical levels. Neuroscience research in sight-recovery individuals uncovers the neural mechanisms of regaining visual functioning on which future treatment and rehabilitation efforts can built on.

OBITUARY

Dr. Challa Subrahmanyam (1945 – 2020)



We deeply regret the passing of Dr. Challa Subrahmanyam (1945 – 2020) in Hyderabad. He was the Founder President of the Governing Board of Goethe-Zenturm Hyderabad between 2004 - 2011.

Dr. Subrahmanyam or Subbu as he was fondly called by his friends, retired as Director Grade Scientist at NGRI (1971 - 2005) and as Emeritus Scientist from 2005-2010. He pursued his M.Sc. in Geophysics from Andhra University, Waltair and Ph.D. in Geophysics from the Indian School of Mines, Dhanbad. Dr. Subrahmanyam's research focused on application of gravity and magnetics where he made significant contributions to the Indian Geophysics studies both on continental and marine aspects leaving behind an inspiring body of research in the annals of Earth Science.

On a DAAD fellowship program in Marine Geophysics Dr. Subrahmanyam was in Hamburg, Germany from 1981 – 1984. He developed a deep appreciation of the German culture and people which he actively maintained through his work with Indo German Nachkontakt Association (IGNA) as Secretary and later President as well as the Goethe-Zentrum Hyderabad.

Dr. Subrahmanyam is fondly remembered as a friendly, humorous, and approachable person. The Governing Board and staff of GZH convey their heartfelt condolences to the family.


