NOT THE ONLY GAY IN THE CITY

A digital photo exhibition by

"What is a relevant location of your queer biography?" was the question raised to 50 gay men in Hamburg by Carsten Bruhn as he was putting together his first big photo project.

Men of different ages and whereabouts, most of them living in Hamburg now, had told him their stories. Stories of their coming-out, their self-discovery, stories of fear and courage, of gay shame in a heteronormative world, of suppression and liberation. Taking part in his project to them was in fact also an expression of their self-portrayal as a gay man, and is indeed a visible expression of their pride. And of them knowing: They are not alone, they are most certainly "Not the Only Gay in the City!"

Carsten Bruhn, born in Kiel in 1965, moved to Hamburg in 2001 and since 2013 he has been married to his husband. He claims to lead two lives. One as a full-time teacher, full of energy and passion for his dream job. The other as a photographer. Humbly declaring of him being an amateur and basically an autodidact, he pursues his "hobby" with just the same amount of energy and passion. He sees through his lens, with or without camera.

INDIA WEEK HAMBURG



08 - 14 November 2021 | Hamburg, Germany



The ninth India Week Hamburg will take place from 8th to 14th of November 2021. Visitors can expect a journey through Hamburg-Indian relations, characterised by events on topics relating to politics, society, science, economy, culture and sports. As in 2019, visitors can look forward to a wide range of India events as diverse and colourful as the country itself!

India Week Hamburg is an event week with 60 to 80 events on topics relating to politics, society, science, business, culture and sports. It takes place over a period of approximately one week at various locations throughout Hamburg. It is organised under the lead of the Senate Chancellery. Its partner also involve the Hamburg Chamber of Commerce, the OAV German Asia-Pacific Business Association, der, Hamburg Invest, the Hamburg Representation Mumbai, the German-Indian Round Table, the Ministry of Culture and Media and the Consulate General of the Republic of India in Hamburg. The aim of India Week Hamburg is to present and intensify the economic, political, scientific and cultural relations between the Hanseatic City and India. Most events are offered free of charge.

HOSHANG MERCHANT IN HAMBURG


INDIA WEEK HAMBURG (08 - 14 NOV)



09 November 2021 | 8 pm CET | Tonali, Hamburg

Hoshang Merchant, professor of English Literature at the University of Hyderabad until a few years ago, was the first contemporary poet in India to openly discuss his homosexuality. He included "Gay Literature" in the academic curriculum and published the first anthology of poetry in India which dealt with the topos of male homosexuality. His own poetry also revolves around themes such as the culture and history of India, the relationship between East and West and his own autobiographical experiences in America, Europe and the Middle East, as well as the world of traditional and contemporary dance.

Exclusively for the event in Hamburg some of Hoshang Merchant's poems will be translated into German for the first time. The author will read the English original, accompanied by an actor who will present the German translation and a dance video produced in India which translates Merchant's visual worlds into choreographed movement. Afterwards there will be an opportunity for a Q & A with the author.

The Indian Photo Festival (IPF) - Hyderabad, a Not-For-Profit initiative of Light Craft Foundation is India's longest running international photography festival showcasing a wide range of photography from India and around the globe with a series of events including: talks and discussions, portfolio reviews, screenings & workshops. The IPF creates a platform for the professional and aspiring photographers, the photography lovers and the public where the festival promotes the art of photography and at the same time addresses the social issues through the medium of photography.

The Indian Photo Festival will be presented largely ONLINE - with all the Interactive Sessions via Virtual Platforms. The PRINT Exhibitions will be installed at the State Art Gallery and along KBR Park located in the heart of the city of Hyderabad. Digital Exhibitions will be showcased at The State Gallery of Art, Madhapur and some fascinating Virtual 3D Exhibitions will be presented online. **The Preview and Launch of the festival is on Thursday, 18th November at 5:00 pm at the State Art Gallery, Hyderabad.**

MANIFESTOS FOR THE NIGHT



A PHOTO EXHIBITION BY RUT BLEES LUXEMBURG

On View: 19 Nov - 19 Dec | State Art Gallery, Hyderabad

About the exhibition: Night has always been a space of alterity and resistance to the conventions and hierarchies of day. Darkness encourages a different mode of perception, perhaps more reflective, more immersive, more durational. These nocturnal photographs of London suggest that nocturnal perception opens up the possibility of a distinct form of nocturnal cognition - more curious, more permissive, more associative, less hierarchical - opening up questions around the status-quo of our urban experience.

About the photographer: Rut Blees Luxemburg's photographic work deals with the representation of the city and the phenomenon of the urban, ranging from large-scale photographs to public art installations and operatic mise-en-scène. Her public art work Silver Forest, a large-scale tableau showing fragments of urban forests, is cast in photographic concrete on the façade of Westminster City Hall in London.

Rut Blees Luxemburg's work is shown internationally including the solo exhibition Phantom at Tate Liverpool and London Dust at the Museum of London. Her work is held in public and private collections including the Pompidou Centre Paris and the V&A Museum, London.

Rut Blees Luxemburg created the iconic cover for The Streets' Original Pirate Material and is a research fellow and reader in urban aesthetics at The Royal College of Art.

GERMAN DAYS
