

The monobloc is the best-selling piece of furniture of all time. Estimates claim there are abillion of these cheap, often white plastic chairs in use – all over the world, in every country and every corner. How could it have come to this?

The feature-length documentary MONOBLOC tells the story of how this unassuming chair ridiculed by many conquered the world. How it destroys livelihoods and brings affluence. How it threatens our environment and 'good taste'. Yet also about how the monobloc is indispensable for millions of people to whom a chair is a chair and nothing more. Grimme Prize winner Hauke Wendler worked on this film for eight years. Together with his camera team he travelled across half the world, from an industrial park in Italy to Uganda, the USA and on to the megacities of India, all the way to a favela in Brazil.

Over the last few years, vocal and assertive Muslim women have woken up in India to find their names on auctioning apps - from Sulli Deals to Bulli Bai, to being lathi charged, locked up in jails, harassed and much more. Efforts are continuously made to dehumanize, discourage and remove them from all spaces - from schools and workplaces, to social media.

Most recently, young Muslim women have been forced to choose between their right to study, and their belief and right to wear what they want -"We are here, present and will continue fighting for haq. We wish we didn't have to fight and resist every day and were given the opportunity to access a bright future."

Shilo Shiv Suleman - award-winning Indian artist and founder of 'The Fearless Collective', whose work is at the intersection of Magical Realism, Art, Technology and Social Justice - weaving together the sensual and sacred, the past and future - through paintings, wearable sculptures, interactive installations and public art interventions. She has exhibited her work in London and Amsterdam.

Sabika is a performance poet and founder of Sar-e-Rahguzar - Poetry on the streets. Co-editor: Bystander Anthology. Senior Editor: SAAG Anthology. She is an INK Fellow, a former campaigns strategist with Change.org, and an alternative educator. She manages the Movement, Community, and Advocacy work at 'The Fearless Collective' and works towards building and supporting artist communities across the globe, specifically South Asia.

Everyone agrees that educating girls is non-negotiable. Yet in recent weeks, Muslim girls have been denied that right. The issue of whether Muslim girls should be allowed to wear hijab as part of their uniform to government educational institutions in Karnataka has raised a storm (and an ongoing court case). It has pitted people on two sides of a debate that has become shrill without providing a solution.

One one side, the People's Union of Civil Liberties (PUCL) Karnataka, in a statement put out in early February, criticised the "arbitrary action by the college authorities" to keep out hijab-wearing students (and later teachers) "as violating fundamental constitutional rights, including the Right to Freedom of Religion (Art 25), the Right to Education (Art 21-A), Right to non-discrimination (Art 15 and Art 29(2)) and the right to dignity (Article 21)". On the other side, there are those who aggressively assert that only those wearing institutionally-approved non-religious uniforms should be permitted entry.

Can there be a discussion about Indian Muslim women and education beyond the binary of hijab and non-hijab? Can we consider the actual status of Muslim women's education in this country and dialogue on the challenges posed to their higher education and find a way together to look at a future that is inclusive? This is what we are attempting through a conversation between women who have looked at these questions from various perspectives.
