





For 18 years, the Syrian Orthodox nun Dayrayto lives on the grounds of a church in Zaz, a dilapidated and abandoned Assyrian village in southeastern Turkey. Together with the monk Abuna she cared for the church for fourteen years. Ever since the monk died four years ago Dayrayto lives alone with her two dogs, a cow, chicken, and three cats. She is vulnerable to multiple threats. Her presence in the region is a thorn in the side of many local actors. There has always been hostilities from the Muslim side and little support from her own community. Lately, the situation is getting worse and Dayrayto fears for her dog's life, which she believes has been deliberately poisoned. The camera follows Dayrayto through her everyday life and observes her struggle for survival, her worries and hardships as fear and loneliness are her constant companions. And yet, Dayrayto is a courageous and fearless woman - she promised Abuna to never leave this holy place and to protect the church, no matter what.

Martina Priessner is a documentary filmmaker and author who lives in Berlin and Istanbul and has been working on German-Turkish migration for many years.

Her most recent film, The Guardian, a portrait of a Syrian Orthodox nun in southeastern Turkey, premiered in the German competition at DOK LEIPZIG 2020. It was awarded the documentary film prize of the Goethe Institute.

Hyderabad based artist Deepa Nath's work has been exhibited in art galleries across India and abroad. Much of Deepa Nath's artistic concerns are with people, especially children, and her personal engagement with underprivileged children leads her to address issues such as their education, gender bias, corporal punishment etc. as in her latest work, a series of paintings, sculpture, prints and drawings titled 'Collective Conscience'. The idea of 'Collective Conscience', the collectible coffee table book, says Deepa Nath, "is an effort to stir our inner conscience to wake up and contribute in whatever way we can to make life a better place for these children".

Padma Shri Shantha Sinha

Shantha Sinha is an Indian anti-child labour activist. She is the founder of Mamidipudi Venkatarangaiah Foundation, popularly known as MV Foundation, and is a professor in the Department of Political science at the University of Hyderabad.

As a rights activist, her contribution to a phenomenal reduction in child labour in nearly 1200 villages of Ranga Reddy district in Telangana is perhaps unparalleled. She was the first chairperson of National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR) for two consecutive terms. She was awarded the civilian honour of Padma Shri by the Government of India in 1998. She has also been awarded with Hyderabad Women of the Decade Achievers Award for Social Service by ASSOCHAM Ladies League.



Wanphrang K Diengdoh is an independent film maker and founder of reddur, a production space for films and music.

In 2011, his debut short film '19/87' bagged all the awards at the GISFF Film Festival.

In 2013, he was awarded the 'Early Career Film Fellowship' from TISS, Mumbai, for his documentary proposal 'Where the Clouds End' – a documentary about tribal identity and border politics.

In 2017, he released 'Because We Did not Choose', a film on the participation of tribal labour in the First World War.

Wanphrang also co-wrote and edited My Name is Eeooow. The film was awarded the prestigious Intangible Culture prize at the Royal Anthropological Institute's Ethnographic Film Festival, UK and Best Film at the Film Festival della Lessinia in 2017.

Lorni-the Flaneur saw his first fiction debut in 2019 which premiered at the prestigious Tallinn Black Nights Film Festival competing for the First Feature Category.

When not making films, Wanphrang writes poetry and music.



Hans Harder (ed.) is Professor, Modern South Asian Languages and Literatures, South Asia Institute, CATS, Heidelberg University.

Dhruv Raina (ed.) is Professor, Zakir Husain Centre for Educational Studies, School of Social Sciences, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi.

About the book:

In India, the modern university as a 'teaching and examining body' was set up as an instrument of colonial governmentality in the late nineteenth century.

Disciplines and Movements studies this historical period till a little after the end of colonialism in India through an exploration of a set of conversations and transnational encounters between Indian and German-speaking intellectuals and academicians at this time. These academics include such important names as Albert Einstein, Girindrasekhar Bose, Sigmund Freud, Swami Vivekananda, and Rabindranath Tagore. These discussions and conversations shaped the contours of disciplines such as psychology and sociology, and of course, in a different way, Indology.
