





Kaavya Dhaara, on 12th November at T-Hub, Phase 2, is going to be an offline day-long festival organized by the HLF committee featuring poets who write in Indian languages and poets from the UK.

Hyderabad Literary Festival (HLF) is an annual event that celebrates creativity in all its forms. HLF is a multidisciplinary, multilingual event that draws over a hundred writers, artistes, academics, scholars, publishers from India and abroad each year.

The one-day poetry festival is a natural extension of HLF's sustained focus on poetry, which often gets sidelined or ghettoized in major literary events. In fact, in the very first edition of HLF in 2010, an overwhelming majority of the 75-odd writers who participated were poets representing nearly two dozen Indian languages. Since then, numerous celebrated poets from India and abroad, have enriched the HLF's audiences with their work. Then in the 2019 edition of the festival, HLF created an independent track for poetry, perhaps the only multi-genre, mainstream literary festival to do so. In 2021, while inaugurating HLF 2021, the eminent poet Gulzar wished for an occasion where one could hear poets reading in their own languages. The present multilingual poetry festival is a modest attempt to create one such platform.

The festival is FREE and OPEN to ALL.

This Exhibition has resulted from young photographers' workshop titled "Heritage Trails" for the students of KVS Hyderabad region organized by Goethe-Institut Chennai and Goethe-Zentrum Hyderabad.

It is a platform for all the KVS children from the regions in Andhra Pradesh & Telangana who were trained to hone their photography skills and be ready to see the world through a different lens.

BOOK LAUNCH & EXHIBITION













GOLCONDA-HYDERABAD: 1975/1996/2012



A Photographic Essay by Thomas Lüttge and Hans Winterberg, edited by Heiko Sievers and published by Rupa publications India, presents the pictorial journey undertaken by Thomas Lüttge and Hans Winterberg.

They charted the changing conditions of historic buildings and architectural marvels of Golconda and Hyderabad through the effects of conservation, preservation, and the development of the city. The photographs in this book (itself 10 years in the making), are a curated selection from an archive of work that spanned a period of forty years. The proposed publication will carefully select some 100 images taken during the project's three phases, thus chronicling the condition of a large number of historical buildings over the four decades.

Instead of a simple mechanistic documentary process of juxtaposing two photographs, one from the distant past with one closer in time, reducing all changes and processes to a single snapshot, the effort here has been to extract a living history of Hyderabad and Golconda. The aim of this publication is to serve as an evocative photo essay and to be understood as a curated artistic venture. Photography is arguably the most suitable medium for capturing such processes. This is why the work of Hans Winterberg and Thomas Lüttge is so important as historical documentation and as a stimulus to conservation movements. In their images, photography serves as material evidence of the encroaching pressures of contemporary urbanization on a significant historic landscape. Their photographs provide a truthful record of a kaleidoscope of rich architectural fragments that are fast fading from urban memory. The book will also include essays by eminent scholars familiar with the architectural history of Hyderabad and the conservation efforts underway. This book highlight two journeys: one from the 16th century to the 20th century, and the other from 1975 to 2012. Now is the time for the viewer to embark on a third journey. This Exhibition is open for all to view.

The 8th edition of the Indian Photo Festival will be presented from 18th November to 19th December, at the State Gallery of Art, Madhapur and other venues across Hyderabad.

The event is free and open to the public. The festival is produced by Light Craft Foundation, a not-for-profit in strategic partnership with the Govt. of Telangana, Telangana Tourism and the State Gallery of Art in Hyderabad.

GERMAN DAYS








OCTOBER & NOVEMBER
