How bees see flowers?

Flowers are evolved to attract bees. Bees have compound eyes composed of thousands of tiny lenses called Ommatidia. These lenses work together to create a mosaic image, which allows bees to see a wider field of view than humans. Bees can see flowers in ultraviolet (UV) light, which is invisible to humans. Flowers have evolved to reflect UV light to attract pollinators like bees. This allows bees to identify the flowers that have nectar and pollen quickly. This exhibition will be an interactive play between these flowers and the viewer.

Tanvir Nagore is a creative technologist who explores the boundaries of art to create unique experiences. He has a keen eye for how technology can be used to enhance the human experience.
Mehdi Saajid is a new media artist who explores the intersection of design, technology, and art. He creates immersive and interactive installations that explore our relationship with technology.
Trilok Chander is an inspirational technophile with a passion for anything involving art, technology, e-sports & video games. He brings a wealth of 15 years of experience in Quality Assurance to his endeavours.

Gender Sensitivity at Workplace

Gender Sensitivity in the workplace is an important part of healthy work culture and promotes the concept of a healthy society. In addition, by law, every member of any academic institution or any workplace must be conversant with The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, commonly known as the PoSH Act, 2013.

Goethe-Zentrum Hyderabad has instituted its ICC since the Government of India recommended this body to be put in place. This session will familiarise participants with the concept, processes, and procedures needed for a gender-diverse context that will improve gender sensitivity and adherence to the prevailing legal provisions.

Dr Kinnera B. Murthy is currently a Strategy Consultant, Director on Corporate Boards and Academic Governing Councils. She is an external member of the Sexual Harassment Committees of corporates as she combines her knowledge of both gender issues and corporate work. She is a Director of the annual Hyderabad Literary Festival and the General Secretary of Apna Watan – an NGO that promotes peace and harmony.

FACES OF CLIMATE RESILIENCE

Faces of Climate Resilience is a short documentary series that captures the voices of people in some of India's most climate-vulnerable regions. The project strives to make climate change more tangible through the lived experiences of people. The focus is on how individuals and communities are responding to the climate crisis. They are embracing nature-based solutions and traditional wisdom. They are mobilising collective action and collaborating with non-profit organisations and local government officials to build climate resilience. The stories include a women's collective in Odisha replanting trees along a cyclone-prone coast, a youth group in suburban Mumbai sensitising slum dwellers about climate change, a women-led group in Uttarakhand working with local forest officials in combating forest fires, a community radio station broadcasting early warning messages and programs on disaster preparedness, an NGO helping pastoralists in Rajasthan adapt to harsh summers and winter through climate resilient infrastructure, and a Kerala town climate proofing its infrastructure after disastrous floods.

Economic Relations: Germany - India

Economic relations with India have become significantly more dynamic and intense in recent years. Economic relations between India and Germany go back more than 500 years and have closely linked the two countries. Not only has bilateral trade increased over the years, but German companies have also discovered new business and investment opportunities in India – just as Indian companies have done in Germany.

Germany is the 7th largest foreign direct investor in India since January 2000. Total investment from Germany in India between 2000 and 2016 is approximately EUR 9 billion. Various programs aim to make doing business in India even easier, such as the Fast Track System for German companies and the Make in India Mittelstand program.

Habeck and Heil promote Germany in India

India is the fifth largest economy in the world. Two German ministers were in the country at the same time and are trying to strengthen the partnership. It is also about skilled workers that Germany so urgently needs. The German language is a big concern for young people. They find that the language level required of nurses from India is too high. "I'll take that with me, but I can't promise anything. The requirement is so high for two reasons," said Heil. "Once to ensure the quality of this special work, the care."On the other hand, speaking the language is also important for integration into society. The Goethe Center in Thiruvananthapuram says that around 90 per cent of the trained nursing staff who want to come to Germany with the state recruitment program Triple Win are women.
