






HYDERABAD LITERARY FESTIVAL

JAN 26-28 | Sattva Knowledge City




The new year brought one of the grandest festivals of the city - The Hyderabad Literary Festival 2024. This year at a brand new venue, the festival was a resounding success!

YASCHA MOUNK @ HLF 2024


JAN 27 | 16:00 Hrs | Sattva Knowledge City



Yascha Mounk, German-born political scientist and author was part of HLF 2024. He has written 5 books, and his latest *The Identity Trap - A Story of Ideas and Power in Our Time* was discussed at the festival. In this book, Mounk writes of how a new set of ideas about race, gender and sexual orientation came to be extremely influential in mainstream institutions, and why it would be a mistake to give up on a more universalist humanism.

Mounk was in conversation with Jaideep Unudurti, graphic novelist and journalist in a session titled The Identity Trap: A Story of Ideas and Power in Our Time. As a Jew born in Germany and now living in New York, Mounk spoke about the politics of identity, democracy, and freedom during his session at HLF 2024.

LUFTHANSA'S DIRECT FLIGHT TO HYDERABAD




Lufthansa launches direct flights from Hyderabad to Frankfurt from 17.1.2024

As the leading European carrier in India, Lufthansa now operates direct connections from Germany to five destinations in India with Hyderabad-Frankfurt being the latest addition. As they launch in Hyderabad, their capacity to India has increased by 14%, making it the fastest growing major market for Lufthansa. After the Hyderabad launch, Indian passengers have 64 weekly flights to Europe and onward connections.

Kanika Mukerjee has been working with fabrics and varied mediums such as charcoal, dry pastels and oil for over three decades. Kanika's solo exhibitions include ICCR, New Delhi; India Habitat Centre, 2018 and Nehru Centre amongst others. She has also participated in multiple group shows.


THE REAL GAME OF THRONES? GOES MEDIEVAL

GOETHE INSTITUT

FEB 27 | 18:30 Hrs | GZH



Prof Dr Racha Kirakosian is affiliated with the Dept of Medieval Studies, Albert Ludwig University of Freiburg & the Committee on the Study of Religion, Harvard University. Her talk at GZH - in light of politicised forms of the preoccupation with the medieval past - calls for critical medievalism. For instance, the popular TV series Game of Thrones operates on medievalist fantasy elements, which are grafted onto a long tradition of appropriating the past, and using it as an imaginary canvas. Investigation into aspects of femininity in conjunction with bestiality, on the one hand, and orientalism, on the other hand, elucidates the ways in which cultural and historical appropriation work. And because medievalist fantasy is not a purely creative preoccupation with the past, it needs our critical attention.

Goethe on Demand



THE LAST PAGE: This 'n That





Dampfnudeln are German steamed yeast dumplings. They are available in the Christmas markets of Germany but are quite delicious to make and enjoy through the year!

INGREDIENTS:

Dough

- 250 grams all-purpose flour
- 3 ½ grams active-dry yeast
- 25 grams sugar
- 125 milliliters luke warm milk
- 1½ grams salt
- 40 grams butter melted
- 1 egg large

Steaming Liquid

- 125 milliliters milk
- 100 grams sugar
- 100 grams butter

Vanilla Sauce

- 450 milliliters milk
- ½ vanilla bean Scraped out, use seeds only.
- 15 grams cornstarch
- 25 grams sugar
- 1 egg yolk large

Topping

- 2 Tablespoons poppy seeds
- 1 Tablespoon powdered sugar

INSTRUCTIONS:

- Mix yeast with sugar and lukewarm milk, let stand for 5 to 10 minutes or until bubbles have started to develop.
- Knead together all remaining ingredients for the dough, then cover and allow to rise for at least an hour in a warm spot.
- Separate dough into 4 pieces and shape into balls/dumplings.
- In a high-rimmed skillet with a lid, mix together the steaming liquid ingredients, bring to a boil, then reduce to just below medium heat and place the dumplings in it, leaving plenty of room between the dumplings to expand (they will double in size!). Top with a lid and do not lift the lid during the next 30 minutes, or else the dumplings will deflate!

Warm Vanilla Sauce:

- Bring the milk, sugar and vanilla bean to a boil.
- Add the cornstarch mixture and bring to a boil again.
- Turn off the heat, whisk in the yolk and pour over the steamed dumplings when ready to serve.
- Combine poppy seeds and powdered sugar for the topping and sprinkle the mixture if desired.
