
Hallo Leseratten!


Join us for simple ideas to make a big impact - for the better lives of humans, and the biodiversity of plants & animals, that we are lucky to share the planet with.



E-waste often contains valuable materials like gold, silver, and copper that can be recovered through recycling. Responsible disposal of e-waste leads to conservation of natural resources and reduces the need for raw material extraction, which can have significant environmental implications.






Dear Future Children tells of the challenges faced by activists of different international movements. The film aims to uncover their motivations and, among other things, also looks at how the organisational forms of the protests evolve.

Dear Future Children focuses on the political work of three activists whose struggles are often associated with enormous personal risk. In Chile, Rayen protests for social justice; in Hong Kong, Pepper is committed to the survival of democracy; and in Uganda, Hilda is dedicated to working against the devastating consequences of climate change. The three narrative threads are linked by the shared irrepressible will of the young activists and their comrades-in-arms to not be defeated by the existing system and to fight for a better world. The events in the respective locations, as well as the people involved, are captured up close and intimately by the camera and director – both on location during protests and public events as well as in very personal conversations.


The Stories Within is an anthology of 20 waste picker voices, through the lens of 20 citizens representing different walks of life. The Stories Within aims to bring forward 20 stories of struggle, change, belief, hope, resilience and willingness to not only dream the impossible but make it a reality. The photos highlight the different stories of the pickers as well as innovative waste management and handling models and the daring experiments conducted by waste pickers.

The discussion with Pune's SWaCH Cooperative, will shed light on the unimaginable hard work, immense contribution and unparalleled determination of waste pickers. A waste picker representative would share challenging yet inspiring anecdotes which would help to gain deeper understanding of the valuable efforts that often remain unacknowledged. The films depict the ethnographic history of the waste picker movement in Pune, told through individual stories of empowerment, transformation and resilience as well as tells the Story of SWaCH which is India's largest wholly-owned waste picker cooperative.
















YESTERDAY-TODAY-TOMORROW

Goethe on Demand







In order to create a lasting positive impact on the environment, here are some tips to help make more conscious decisions in your everyday life.


- **Fight Climate Change with Diet Change:** Moving towards a plant based diet is a more sustainable option. The global meat production creates more greenhouse gas emissions than every plane, train and automobile in the world.
- **Pick-up trash while you run:** This is a simple way to not only ensure trash is appropriately disposed, but also a way to enable a clean and pleasing environment.
- **Switch to reuseable bags:** It is estimated we use 4 trillion plastic bags each year world wide. The average plastic bag is only used for 10-20 minutes but stays in the environment for over 1000 years.

It provides a range of environmental benefits, including improving soil health, reducing greenhouse gas emissions, recycling nutrients, and mitigating the impact of droughts.
- **Use a reuseable water bottle:** A simple and effective tip that not only reduces waste, but also saves money. The best option is a metal or glass bottle, as it has the least negative impact on health and the environment.
- **Practice sustainable fashion:** Sustainable fashion is a way in which brands create clothing that not only reduces the impact on the environment but are also mindful of the people who work to produce the garments. It is fashion that is ethically made and environmentally friendly.
